- R & L Jeremy Kinne/Calvin Tower/Calvin Bartlett/Wm. Rice/Vaughan
- L Henry Drake and brother, Walter Buxton/Grady, Knowles Hill, 2022'
- R Memorial Boulder on Dingle Road, Glen Grove Wildlife Sanctuary
- L Bradburn basket factory, Owned by Carsley, Fairman, Majlinger
- L Glenwood Farm - Skelton, now owned by Sam and Liz Rogers
- L Former site of Frank Robinson farm, now cut up into lots
- L East Windsor Road school made into a dwelling for Walter Davis
- R Built around 1810 by Arunah Bartlett, home of Wm. Carters
- L Blueberry plantation planted by Billings, now Tomaselli
- L Built in 1860, Shipman farm, now owned by James B. Clarke
- R Return to Rt. 143
- R Site of Russell Tower place/John Yale, Bashan Hill 2011'
- R Drive over Bashan Hill to Parish Road
- L Ted and Emily Mix camp.....Chet Wisner camp
- L Geo. Leighton place, now owned by Rbt. Cook
- L Jeff Fowler place
- L Intersection of Bashan Hill Road and Parish Road, Windsor Corner
- L Follow Parish Road by several camps
- L Gravel bank on Parish Road used to build East Windsor Road
- L Parish Farm formerly of 600 acres, now owned by Eliz Harlow
- R Stone Bridge
- R Site of Frankie's Place, long a popular watering spot
- R Junction of Parish Road, River Road and Route 143
- R Willard Jones place now being renovated by Dr. Wm. Clark
- R Turning west on Rt. 143; site of Jones tannery
- R West Worthington Methodist Church, built in 1859, discon. 1920
- R Marcus Brown place b. in 1842, now residence of Dr. Gerald Lemieux
- R Return to downtown West Worthington and enter River Road
- R Site of Jones mill, bedsteads, bureaus, and whip butts made here
- L Thayer, Shaw, Britt place, residence of Paddock and Raynor later
- L Brookstone Hard to Find Tools est. here, now home of Newborne Co.
- R Built c. 1810 for Medbury, site of his and Oliver Parish' mills
- R Site of Abraham and Charles Granger homes, formerly of Medbury
- R Built by Oliver Parish, now home of Gary Tompkins
- L Site of Medbury Tannery above Falls
- L Beginning of West Worthington Falls and Gorge
- R Early homes of Geer brothers, now res. of Darrell Shedd and James Dodge
- L Site of Osgood school, discontinued in about 1915
- R Farm est. by Orin Granger, Geo. Osgood place, now Dr. Carsley's
- R Tinker farm for 5 generations, now owned by Paul Grafsteins
- l & R Village of Smith Hollow, Smiths, Fisks, Rothmans, Borsts, Devries
- R Return over River Road to downtown West Worthington, noting in passing the ford in the river as it crosses to Sam Hill Road, end of Starkweather Road opposite Osgood Road.
- R Note yellow house facing River Road b. by Willard Jones in 1850
- R Post Office in this house as well as the other Jones house now owned by Dr. Clarke
- R Location of Lindsay Tavern?
- L Former school now owned by the Henry Paysons
- R Turn into Lindsay Hill Road and proceed to Worthington Corners
- R Arcouette home, a Sears and Roebuck house sold thro' catalog
- L Cady Farm, now home of the Dr. Hudson Bates family
- R Home of John and Mae Roske, formerly Dwight Raymond farm
- R Stone gates at the Julian Rice place, now Ben Reed estate
- L Sena Auction Barn and home complex, former Blackman farm
- R Buffington House, Alexander Miller tavern site, site of first town meeting....
