

The Hilltop Restaurant and Bar

Located in South Worthington, just before the bridge was a Bar called HILLTOP restaurant owned by the The Sipo Family. The eating area and the bar was in the lower half of the home. It was a popular place to have some refreshments, visit with friends, play the "juke box" - a foreign concept in today's world.

You could dance, eat and just have a good time. It was a "Watering Hole " for lots of truckers coming home from a week on the road. Worthington did have a lot of truckers during the 50' and 60"s . That was perhaps the last stop for most unless you lived beyond the Worthington Corners.

The Hilltop was eventually sold to the Robert Schrades of New York City, pianists who preformed at Carnegia Hall in New York City and South Worthington during the summer. Robert and Rolande were the parents of Robelyn, Randolph, Rorianne, Rolisa and Rondalee, hence the name of their long running concert series "Sevenars Concerts." Soon came David James who marrie Robelyn and had children Lynelle and Christopher. In recent years the family lost Robert, Rolande and Robelyn but still perform at the "Sevenars" in the concert hall pictured below formerly known as Conwell Academy and previously owned by the Fox Family.
