"Charles's County Cousin" was given for benefit of the Woman's Benevolent Society to furnish and furnish their new kitchen at the Church.

"Mrs. Jarley Up to Date" benefit Wintonston Golf Club

"Dr. Hardbanks Prescription" benefit Junior Christian Education Society for Missionary work.

"The Home Queen" a play in verse. benefit of a walk between the 2 Wintonston villages which lie about a mile apart. This was in connection with a Home Show.

"Good King Wenceslas" a Christmas Entertainment for old and young.

"Uncle Joes Jewel." Benefit of Wintonston Library, 1<sup>st</sup> representation.

"Uncle Joes Jewel" 2<sup>d</sup> after representation for benefit of Church + parish work. At the matinee a table of Parisian and other novelties for benefit of new scenery and curtains for stage.
