**WORTHINGTON.**—On Monday night, Dec. 6th, the store of H. Cole & Son, in Worthington, was broken into and their safe opened by picking the lock. From this safe \$300 in cash was stolen, but a package of \$500 in another pigeon hole was left untouched. In this safe was the key of the town safe, kept in the same building, and with this key the robbers opened the public safe and stole therefrom about \$500 more. Here also they left more than they took, as a package of about \$700, which the town treasurer had packed away for the payment of the state tax, was unmolested. Mr. Samuel Cole, the town clerk and treasurer, was in the store at half past 5 o'clock Tuesday morning, and at once discovered the robbery. Assistance was rallied and search made on all the roads, but nothing was found to indicate the direction the robbers took. A furious snowstorm was raging at the time, and whatever tracks were made were speedily obliterated by the drifting snow. Messrs. Cole & Son and the town treasurer offer a reward of \$200 for the recovery of the money and the conviction of the thieves, or \$100 for either.
