According to records of the Post Office Department now in our custody, a post office was established at Worthington, Hampshire County, shortly before July 1, 1796, the date of the first return from the deputy postmaster to the Postmaster General. A site location report of January 24, 1912, from the Postmaster shows that the office was located 100 rods northeast of Wards Stream.
