## Mrs. Cynthia L. Tower

March 21.—Mrs. Cynthia L. Tower, aged 71, died at her home this morning after a week's illness with bronchitis. No alarm was felt about her until about midnight and death came at about two o'clock this morning. Mrs. Tower was born in Worthington Sept. 7, 1856, the daughter of Walter S. and Henrietta Harrington Allen, in the house now owned by James Corbett. On Jan. 19, 1876, she married Henry L. Tower. Besides her husband she leaves three children, Walter H., at home, Herbert L. of Springfield, and Cullen B. of Thompsonville, Ct., and five grandchildren, Dorothy, Edith, Madison and Elizabeth and Mrs. Ralph Curley of Springfield.
