

## DIED,

In Southampton, on Saturday last, Jonathan Judd, Esq. aged 74.

In Worthington, on the 21st January, Mrs. NANCY BURR, in the 34th year of her age. Thirteen years since she presented herself alone, and at a time of no uncommon attention to religion, united with the church, and all who were acquainted with her can testify that she appeared ever to have the direction of St. Paul in her recollection—*As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk ye in him.* From her sober and cheerful deportment, her compassions, in youth, had reason to conclude, that while many of them were sipping at the broken cisterns of sensual gratification, she was, with joy, drawing water out of the wells of salvation. She has left an infant child, but she has left it with that God to whom she devoted it, and He is the father of orphans. Possessed of a disposition peculiarly mild and amiable, and of an implanted principle of faith, which uniformly works by love, her death will be sensibly felt by her husband; and, perhaps, not less by his parents, who live in the same house, for they had placed great dependance upon her as the solace of their declining years, and they think there is no one like minded, who would, naturally, care for their state. Her own parents, brethren and sisters, and all her friends, mourn with unfeigned and deep sorrow for the loss which they sustain in the removal of such a person from them. She seems to say from those mansions into which we hope she has been received:

*The world is nought to me,  
From all its cares I'm free;  
No more a mother or a wife;  
My friends, my counsel take,  
Leave all for Jesus' sake,  
And he will be your Lord and life.*
