Nicholas Worthington married a Susanna ---- (2nd wife) and among their children was Lieutenant John Worthington, born Aug. 17, 1679, at Springfield, Mass. Died Dec. 30, 1744, He married Mary Prett (Born May 24, 1677) daughter of John Pratt and wife Mary Andrews of Saybrook, Conn. Lieutenant John Worthington received from the English government a large tract of land, part of which is included in the City of Springfield. The first street laid out in Springfield was called "Worthington Street". The land descended by right of the English law of entail to the eldest son, John, who, leaving no sone, it passed to his daughters.

Among Lieutenant John Worthington's children was Samuel, born
July 11, 1725 at Springfield. Samuel's son, Samuel Jr., was born
Dec. 29, 1749 at Springfield, Mass. Samuel, Jr. merried three times.
He lived at Salem, N. Y. Among children by his first wife, Olive
Dewey, was: John Worthington, born Jan. 20, 1771.

John Worthington (great grandson of Lt. John Worthington of Springfield) was born (1766 or 1771). He died April 18, 1855, and left nine children. He married Priscilla Smith (born 1776). They lived at Freedom, N. Y. (Freedom is eight miles from Rushford, N. Y.) Their nine children were: Thaddeus, Olive, Samuel, John, Rebecca, Squire
