HUMPHREY DENIED SUSPENDED TERM

NORTHAMPTON — George W. Humphrey, 44, of Old Post Rd., Worthington will face a Superior Court trial on counterfeiting charges. A District Court conference Friday failed to bring a suspended sentence on the charge.

Humphrey was found guilty in District Court June 8, 1961, on a charge of possessing counterfeiting materials. He allegedly was dealing with a ring buying government surplus ball bearings, packaging them in boxes with counterfeited labels of major ball bearing manufacturers and selling them at lower prices than the manufacturers.

Humphrey reportedly was counterfeiting the labels in his printing plant in Worthington. He was arrested May 13, 1961, while allegedly on parole after serving 13 months of an 18-month sentence in Federal Prison in Danbury, Conn. This resulted from a money-counterfeiting charge in 1957.

His counsel, a Springfield attorney, conferred with Judge Luke F. Ryan, who sentenced Humphrey to six months in jail, which he appealed. Also in on the conference were District Atty. Sanford Keedy and two state police officers, retired Lt. John Loughlin, who prosecuted the original case, and Sgt. Vincent Mulloy, who also investigated.
