The Schrade family pianists, Robert, Rolande, Randolph, Rorianne and Robelyn Schrade with **David James** unite for the twenty-fifth festival season. The Eroica Trio, exciting 1991 winners of the prestigious Naumburg Chamber Music Award consists of Adela Peña, violinist; Sara Sant' Ambrogio, cellist; and Erika Nickrenz, pianist. Individually, each has won an impressive number of major prizes, and as a group, founded in 1986, it recently received enthusiastic praise for its performance at Lincoln Center's Alice Tully Hall, and is already earning a reputation as one of America's important new chamber ensembles.


August 2, Sunday, 5:00 p.m.
