Before the tournament, there will be a \$50,000 shootout contest and putting competition.


Proceeds will benefit the nonprofit It Takes A Community Foundation.

The foundation was started by Lewis and his wife, Vanessa Lewis, who live in Worthington, to aid small towns facing financial difficulties. The foundation pitched in to help the R.H. Conwell Community Education Center in Worthington. a private elementary school created by townspeople after the Gateway Regional School District closed Worthington's elementary school due to budget cuts. The foundation has funded the school desks, books, school supplies and teachers' salaries.

"This year the tournament's proceeds will go 100 percent to the R.H. Conwell Community Education Center. Next year, it will go somewhere else," said Walter Fritz, a resident of Worthington and the event's coordinator.

Sandri Companies, a Greenfield-based energy company,
which owns the Crumpin-Fox
Golf Club, and Timothy Van
Epps, who serves as president
of both organizations, are also
supporters of the school, said
Fritz. "His wife, Wendy, came
up to the school during an
open house and was very impressed with what Vanessa and
Aaron are trying to do," he said.
Residents of Northampton, the
couple have given their help by
hosting the golf tournament.
