Fuller to the first mentioned bound, being all the land included in these bounds except a small piece formerly deeded to Charly Clapp and another to Dan Daniels by the late Hon. Ezra Starkweather, it being the farm on which said Starkweather last lived. Also my Pew in the Congregational Meeting house and a Horse shed, and my household furniture, and my farm stock, and tools, and all my other estate, real personal or mixed.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the before-granted premises, with the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said Abel P. Drury his heirs and assigns, to their use and behoof forever: And I do, for myself my heirs, executors and administrators, covenant with the said Abel P. Drury his heirs and assigns, that I am lawfully seized in fee of the before-granted premises; that they are free of all incumbrances,

that I have good right to sell and convey the same to the said Abel P. Drury and that I will warrant and defend the same premises to the said Abel P. Drury his heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.
