WOOL.—Agents from the Manufacturers of Webster and other towns have recently visited this county and Berkshire, and purchased large quantities of wool in Worthington, Peru, Hinsdale, Windsor, &c. Many loads of wool passed through this place last week. We are informed that the prices given range from 47 to 70 cents, and the quality of the wool from half blood to full blood and Saxony fleeces. We have heard of only two lots that brought 70 cts. What is called full blood merino brought from 55 to 64 cents; much of it was sold from 58 to 60 cents. Such is the information we have received; it may not be entirely correct.—*Hampshire Gazette.*
